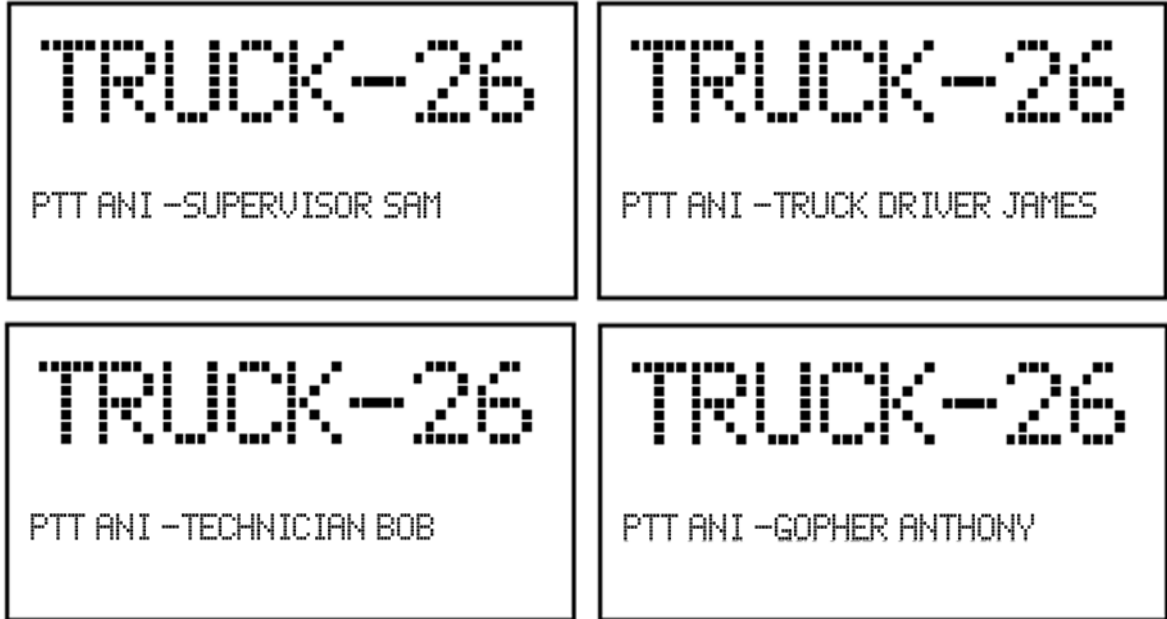


Recognizing Multiple Radio Team Members

Truck 26 has four team members, all with their own radios. With this application, all radios will be displayed as TRUCK-26, and each member will be uniquely described on the C Plus III secondary display.

Examples:

These examples show how each radio is a part of truck number 26 and whose radio is being used. The "assignment" field (like SUPERVISOR SAM) is capable of containing a maximum of 19 characters.



Why it Works:

Each radio is programmed with a unique ANI ID number, but when it is received by the C Plus III with Alias feature, the C Plus displays the information stored in the Alias table instead of the ID. For the examples above, here are the required alias table entries:

00000001, TRUCK-26, SUPERVISOR SAM, 1

00000002, TRUCK-26, TRUCK DRIVER JAMES, 1

00000003, TRUCK-26, TECHNICIAN BOB, 1

00000004, TRUCK-26, GOPHER ANTHONY, 1

Special Requirements:

The optional feature "Alias" must be purchased and activated on the C Plus III. Contact Cimarron Technologies for information.
